## Uniform Rules \& Regulations 2023/24

We are judged, initially, by appearance, and a high standard of dress reflects credit on the student and the school.
The Uniform is available to purchase from Cojo's in Louth, Greenswear in Cleethorpes. Other suppliers may not sell the correct items listed below.

It is advisable to take your child with you when buying uniform.

## Years 7 to 11

## Skirt Uniform

- Blazer Navy blue with school badge
- Skirt Pendle pleated Skirt (on the knee)
- Blouse Classic white open neck blouse
- School tie No tie required with the open necked blouse.
- Jumper Navy V-neck with embroidered school badge
- Shoes Black leather type school shoes, not trainers
- Socks White socks / black tights
- Scarf School scarf or plain black, navy or dark grey
- Coat An appropriate coat of any colour may be worn



## Trouser Uniform

- Blazer Navy blue with school badge
- Trousers Mid grey standard trousers or regular fit tailored trousers - in Grey - not lycra
- Shirt Classic white collared shirt
- School tie Clip-on Navy Stripe for Yrs 7 \& 8; Red Stripe for Yrs 9, 10 and 11
- Jumper Navy V-neck with embroidered school badge
- Shoes Black leather type school shoes, not trainers
- Socks Plain dark grey socks
- Scarf School scarf or plain black, navy or dark grey
- Coat An appropriate coat of any colour may be worn


Any accessories: Gloves, hair essentials, etc. should all be black, navy or dark grey.
Hair bobbles to tie long hair back are essential.
There will be a small supply of ties to purchase from Reception, should students lose them during term time.
PLEASE NOTE: No trainers or canvas shoes. No boots unless under trousers

## PE Uniform

- School Winter Sports Shirt - waterproof round neck top
- School Embroidered Polo Shirt
- Plain Black Leggings/Skins - leggings with KEVIGS on calf (optional if pupils prefer the short option)
- School Shorts - 3 options (all in navy with red and white flashing)
- Skort
- Traditional shorts
- Shorts with lycra inner
- Optional - Plain black skins (can be worn under Polo when cold)
- Red socks for Winter Sports / White socks for Summer Sports
- Training Shoes (non-marking soles)
- Football boots with safety studs
- Shin Pads

Optional PE equipment

- Astro trainers (cannot be worn in the sports hall)
- Tennis racket
- Gum shield (strongly recommended)
- Hockey stick

All the above items are essential for all students, except where indicated otherwise. Please make sure all items of clothing are clearly marked with student's name. The School is not responsible for lost items.

## Make up and jewellery

- Ideally no jewellery should be worn.
- A watch is permitted.
- One single plain, flat (signet style) ring is permitted.
- One single pair of plain ear studs (not hoops/rings/flesh tunnels) can be worn, one in each ear bottom lobe, not in other areas of the ears.
- No other items must be visible.
- Necklaces and Bracelets in any form are not to be worn. The only exception is the Sikh Kara.
- Tongue piercings, facial jewellery or similar body piercings must never be worn.
- Any new piercings/flesh tunnel procedures that require a 'healing period' should only take place during school holidays that are long enough to accommodate this healing process.
- All piercings (other than what is allowed as stated above) must be removed and not simply covered up with plasters during school time.
- No jewellery should be worn during physical education or other practical activities.
- Ideally no make-up; where this is worn, it should be very light and discreet.
- Hair should be clean and well groomed. Hair dye, if used, should be discreet and of a natural colour. The use of bright or garish colours is not permitted.
- Tattoos (permanent or semi-permanent) should not be visible.
- Coloured nail varnish and false nails are not allowed. No false, acrylic, gel or shellac nails. No false eyelashes.


## KEVIGS Sixth Form-Dress Code

## GENERAL

Sixth-form students will be attending a site where students in Years 7 to 11 will be in school uniform. While there is no uniform for sixth-form students, they should dress in a manner appropriate to a school environment and that adheres to the dress code given below.

## CLOTHING

Smart trousers, dress or skirt, a formal shirt or blouse, and a plain jumper or jacket would be suitable. These should be worn with smart shoes (or ankle boots). A tie is optional.

Please take the dress code into careful consideration before purchasing any items for September. Please also note that any extremes in appearance are not advised. If in doubt, please seek advice from the sixth-form team. The following additions guidance may help (but is not comprehensive).

## Trousers/Skirts/Dresses

Denim, leggings (or equivalent), shorts, combat/cargo trousers and PVC/leather are not permitted. Overly short, tight or revealing clothing is unsuitable.

## Tops and Jumpers

No crop tops, vest-style tops, spaghetti straps, and low-cut or transparent clothing. Clothing bearing large or inappropriate slogans or brand-names should not be worn, nor should sweatshirts and hoodies.

## Footwear

Smart, formal footwear is to be worn. Croc-style shoes, Ugg-style boots, knee-high or thigh-high boots, flip-flops and sliders are not suitable, nor are excessive heels or wedges. Trainers and canvas shoes are not permitted.

## Outdoor Clothing

Hats and coats should be taken off in the classroom. Baseball caps are not permitted.

## MAKE-UP

Make-up should be discreet. Excessive make-up, including bright colours, is not acceptable.

## JEWELLERY

Jewellery should be minimal and appropriate for a working environment. Discreet facial jewellery is permitted, but small, plain studs should be worn. Excessive use of facial jewellery is not permitted.

## TATTOOS

Tattoos must not be visible if they have the potential to cause offence.

## HAIR

Hair should be clean and well groomed. Hair dye, if used, should be discreet and of a natural colour. The use of bright or garish colours is not permitted.
